Sanskrit is an ancient and classical language of India, in which ever first book of the world Rigveda was compiled. It is a standardised dialect of Old Indo-Aryan, originating as Vedic Sanskrit and tracing its linguistic ancestry back to Proto-Indo-Iranian and Proto-Indo-European. Today it is listed as one of the 22 scheduled languages of India and is an official language of the state of Uttarakhand. It is considered as the mother of all languages.

The meaning of Sanskrit is refined, decorated or produced in perfect form. The language is also known for its clarity and beauty. It is also a language of Hinduism, Buddhism and Jainism. This is the only language that is used in holy functions and ceremonies of Hindus, as it has always been regarded as the sacred language of the religion, also termed as the language of Gods. Before the Arab invasion, Sanskrit served as the National language of the Indian subcontinent.

of Hindus. The oldest known texts in Sanskrit are the Rigveda, Sama-veda, Yajur-veda and the Atharva-veda. Classical Sanskrit based on the old Vedic speech came up approximately between 500 B.C.-1000 A.D. It was the period after which Panini composed his grammar of Sanskrit. The two great epics of this period were Ramayana and Mahabharata. Through the development of early classical Sanskrit literature, the oral tradition was maintained. Sanskrit was spoken in an oral society and the writing was not introduced to India until after Sanskrit had evolved into the Prakrits. The regional scripts of the scribe influenced the choice of writing system. Devanagari has been considered as the effective writing system for Sanskrit since the late 19th century.

In the present scenario, Sanskrit is considered by many scholars to be a dead language. The Government of India actively promotes Sanskrit as a third language throughout the primary education system and modern scholars across oceans now have begun to study and encourage conversations in Sanskrit, among a steadily growing student community. **Mathur Village** is the last Sanskrit speaking village left in India. Mathur is a small temple town lost in the midst of the plentiful villages found in Karnataka in the southern part of India.

Recently, there has been a surge in interest in Sanskrit tattoo designs and symbols among Hollywood and other celebrities. One of the reason being, Sanskrit language possesses some magical charm and many believe that it comes with unbelievable powers. Therefore those who have this design feel that they are not only lucky but are also in state of receiving universal blessings. Another reason that has made the design popular is its beauty and elegance. This is because it is horizontal in nature but comes with a lot of flowing curves. It is also flexible to be inked in an elaborated manner.
